STEWARDING CREATIVITY

In the words of author Michele Shea. "Creativity is...seeing something that doesn't exist already. You need to find out how you can bring it into being and that way be a playmate with God."

Playing with God? What an odd concept! It is especially jarring to present the notion in this solemn book dedicated to the

mystery of human suffering. If you wouldn't be inclined to pair God with frivolity in the same thought, the idea may even seen to smack of sacrilege. But consider a sampling of God's words to Job.

"Who let the wild donkey go free? Who untied its ropes?... It laughs at the commotion in the town: it does not hear a driver's shout." (Job 39:5,7)

"The wings of the ostrich flap joyfully, though they cannot compare with the wings and feathers of the stork... She treats her young harshly, as if they were not hers; she cares not that her labor was in vain, for God did not endow her with wisdom or give her a share of good sense. Yet when she spreads her feathers to run, she laughs at horse and rider."

(Job 39:13, 16-18)

"Can you pull in Leviathan with a fishhook or tie down its tongue with a rope? Can you put a cord through its nose or pierce its jaw with a hook? Can you make a pet of it like a bird or put it on a leash for the young women in your house?" (Job 41:1-2,5)

> As God describes his creation, note the colorful language and clever word pictures. It is even possible to see the subtle humor. God's attitude toward his servant's pain is certainly not flippant or facetious, but he does direct Job to think about incongruities and mysteries of life.

Are you able to appreciate the glimpses of humor

and joy that often punctuate life's circumstances, even the times of grief or sorrow? Seeing more than just the bleak picture is one way in which creativity brings depth to our experiences. When we allow ourselves to fully embrace the world as it is--often confusing, nonsensical or contradictory--creativity helps us to make sense of the human condition.


