
GIFT "Thanks be to God for his indescribable gift!" 2 Corinthians 9:15

Christmas is right around the corner and most of us are busy getting ready to find the right gift to give each person on our list. Sometimes we even exchange the first gift because we find a better one. We forget that the first Christmas was very simple, Joseph and Mary looking for the right place to bring the baby, who would one day bring

salvation. Should we be asking, are we putting so much time and energy on things which are fleeting? Should we be thinking of how we are to relate to a child who is asking: what is Hanging of the Greens all about or what is advent? Maybe we should be thinking more of the event when God gave us the gift of HIS Son.

God is the greatest giver. The truth that Jesus Christ is the "gift" of God who had far reaching impact on the world. Not just at the time of His birth, but even today. By forgetting that Christ is a gift, we tend to forget the Father's compassion for us. Secondly, if Christ is the "gift" of God then we should acknowledge the Father's GRACE. Christ was a king who came not to take, but to give. His gift was the ultimate sacrifice and therefore each of our Christmas gifts bring the focus back to where it should belong.

So, let us remember what the "Gift" is--this Christmas season. Here is a Christmas prayer to go along with our gift. "Please Lord Jesus forgive me for being

so grumpy as I trudge through the neverending tasks set before me this holiday season. My to-do list seems to keep growing with shopping, church services, and family gatherings--and I'm running short on time! Restore the joy of Christmas to my heart... and help me to relax each day and make time for YOU...my one true source of Joy. In the name of Christ my Lord, Amen."

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL HIGHLIGHTS OF OCTOBER 2016 MEETING

September minutes and financial report approved.

<u>Deacons Report</u>: Deacons to host at the Stand Up for Vets event in Murphysboro, November 5th. Will collect toiletries, food items and clothing to give to local vets. A donation to the Elks Children's Fund was sent in loving memory of Mike Porter. Christmas gifts will be delivered to our shut-ins on December 12th. Deacons will be providing the desserts for the new members luncheon on November 6th.

<u>Outreach & Evangelism Report:</u> Moses Gary is organizing the Halloween Outreach. <u>Missions Report:</u> Discussed summer mission trip to Jamaica. Jovan Davis, from the church in Jamaica, would like to visit FBC. First Mission trip meeting for those who would like to go is following the chicken & dumpling dinner.

<u>Children's Discipleship Report:</u> 4-7 children will be baptized on Nov. 6th. There will be a live nativity at the Hanging of the Greens. FBC Kids will provide the entrainment for the Christmas Banquet.

<u>Youth Discipleship Report:</u> Youth are going to Sikeston to the corn maze and Kristy & John Dunning are hosting bonfire/wiener roast for the youth and their families.

Adult Discipleship Report: The Women's Conference was enjoyed by many. Technology Report: New light switch was installed downstairs and is working. New light bulbs for the digital projector on the ceiling cost \$570 each.

<u>Staff Relations Report:</u> The Pastoral Relations meeting was last night. An opportunity has presented itself to send Shaker and Nicolette on a Max Lacado Ministries trip to the Holy Land in March. This is a wonderful way to mark the anniversary of Shaker's 10th year at FBC. DINNER AT MCALISTERS TO HELP 2017 JAMAICA SUMMER MISSION TRIP



FROM PASTOR...JUST FOR FUN BOOK EXCERPT FROM <u>BECAUSE OF BETHLEHEM</u>

Dear Ladies,

We know you mean well. We know you think you know best. But enough is enough. We have suffered in silence for too long. Having shared our pain with one another, we husbands hereby step out of the shadows and open our hearts. This year as you shop for our Christmas gifts, please don't buy us what we need.


