2. 1 Kings 8:56, "Praise be to the LORD,

who has given rest to his people Israel just as he promised. Not one word has failed of all the good promises he gave through his servant Moses.

3. Joshua 21:45, "Not one of all the LORD's good promises to the house of Israel failed; every one was fulfilled."

4. Joshua 23:14, "Now I am about to go the way of all the earth. You know with all your heart and soul that not one of all the good promises the LORD your God gave you has failed. Every promise has been fulfilled; not one has failed."

5. 2 Peter 3:9, "The Lord is not slow in keeping his promise, as some understand slowness. He is patient with you, not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance."

6. Hebrews 10:23, "Let us hold unswervingly to the hope we profess, for he who promised is faithful."

4. In 2 Tim. 4:16-17, Paul wrote, "At my first defense, no one came to my support, but everyone deserted me. May it not be held against them. But the Lord stood at my side and gave me strength..."

5. That's what God does for his people. He sticks close to them.

God has also promised: "I will strengthen you."

1. I like Isaiah 41:10, "So do not fear, for I am with you; do not be dismayed, for I am your God. I will strengthen you and help you; I will uphold you with my righteous right hand."

2. 2 Thess. 3:3, "But the Lord is faithful, and he will strengthen and protect you from the evil one."

3. That's why Paul declared, "I can do everything through him who gives me strength." (Phil. 4:13)

4. I know that it's because of God's strength that I am who I am and do what I do. There's no way I could do even half of what I do on my own!

One final precious promise: "I will come again."

1. John 14:1-3, "Do not let your hearts be troubled. Trust in God; trust also in me. In my Father's house are many rooms; if it were not so, I would have told you. I am going there to prepare a place for you. And if I go and prepare a place for you, I will come back and take you to be with me that you also may be where I am."

2. How wonderful to know that we are saved and that we have eternal life.

3. 1 John 2:25, "And this is what he promised us – even eternal life."

4. 1 John 5:13, "I write these things to you who believe in the name of the Son of

God so that you may know that you have eternal life."

5. Jesus is coming back, and he will take us to live with him...forever. That's a promise!

HOW DO WE RECEIVE GOD'S PROMISES?

First we need to Prayerfully Study our Bibles.

Second, to receive God's promises we must patiently wait.

A third aspect of receiving God's promises is living in obedience to God's will.

A final way that we receive God's promises is by FAITH.

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL JANUARY 2017 MINUTES

Additions to the Agenda: Date for March Council meeting is March 14th. Date for business meeting is March 19th. Last Meeting's Minutes: The January 22, 2017 minutes were approved by consensus.

Financial Report: The January, 2017 Financial Report was approved by consensus. Jesse presented a more concise financial statement format that he and Jeff put together.

Outreach & Evangelism: 3 on 3 Basketball Tournament is March 3, more volunteers needed; Easter outreach--congregational invitations; Dinner for 8 program will be discussed after Easter; Ministerial Alliance Spring Festival will be May 19th at the old MCA school from 5-7 pm and will benefit the school social workers.

Missions: 2017 Jamaica Mission Trip has 18 people planning on going, budget has been worked out and are meeting monthly. Ron McLaughlin is working on the Community Garden. 2016 missions percentage was 12.5% of total budget. They are working on the percentage for 2017.

Children Discipleship: Nursery teachers needed. Kids Conference is April 1st. Kids camp is July 19-22 and leaders/adult volunteers are needed.

Youth Discipleship: Holding a flower sale with the annual yard sale. Discussed potential fund raiser ideas.

Staff Relations/Policies: Next staff quarterly meeting will be in April. Will be applying for the Internship Grant through Great Rivers Region.

Finance & Stewardship: Israel trip donation update-\$8420 collected. There is an ABC Conference in Portland and Shaker has

been asked to go by GRR. Building & Grounds: There will be a Spring Cleaning event before Easter--Sunday School classes are to clean their rooms. Forming a Building and Grounds Ministry Team/possible maintenance plans. Create a chart or log for maintenance. Look into potential maintenance agreements. \$350 for new decals on the bus and van. They will be put on the van but the bus will be at a later date after the rust is fixed. Looking at exterior lighting as well as repairing existing lights and possibly adding more lights. New parking lot estimates and seal coating--have received bids for gravel, removing the tree and paving for overflow parking area.

Security: The Security Group will be going to a Sheepdog seminar on March 14th. Cameras are working well. Currently using iPad tablets to monitor. A small TV will be hard wired to split screen to see all cameras at once and will be located at the Welcome Center.

Special Events: A 10th Anniversary Reception for Shaker will be April 23rd. He will be sharing his Israel trip during worship and reception will follow worship. Worship Ministry: A Baptism service on February 25th; Guest Speaker, Paul Gibson from ABC-GRR will be here on February 25th. SI "Church Music" event would have area church groups sign up to sing is still in the works.

College Group Discipleship: College scholarships are available through ABC, FBC, and Ministerial Alliance. Ministerial Alliance has a \$1000 scholarship for graduating high school students; ABC-GRR also have scholarships available. FBC at one
