also with people who were in authority, rich and well to do. He understood life in many aspects. He was with the people at weddings, at funerals, at the synagogs. He also served at the campfires and sat with people of means. Jesus understood despair, needs, suffering, shame and not being wanted and being abused. Why?

Additions to the Agenda: June 4 social event for leadership council families. February, 2017 minutes were approved. Financial Report: February 2017 report was approved by consensus. \$8645.00 has been collected for pastor's trip. Deacons Report: Sent a teen to WinterJam. Sent thank you notes. Visitations made. Contributions made for tornado victims. Looking at helping with mission trip. Minstry Team Reports:

Outreach and Evangelism: Easter Outreach will be shared with congregation and there will be invitations for the congregation to give out. Dinner for 8 Program will try to launch in May. There will be information to give out. Ministerial Alliance Spring Festival is May 19.

Missions: 2017 Jamaica Mission Trip: Team will be providing help with a construction project. Chicken and dumpling dinner raised \$1,114.00. Will be sending out support letters. Next fund raiser is Tag Day. Community Garden: Ron McLaughlin is working on this project. 2016 Mission percentage giving is still being worked on. Kristy gave MHS counselors information on the Ministerial Alliance Scholarship. Rachel Edgar will be doing a Missions Moment. Rachel Edgar and Nick Dobbs are willing to meet with small groups to provide information on their mission trips. **Children Discipleship:** Kids Camp July 19-22--Kathie Grob will be attending and would like to take Nowel as a volunteer helper.

Youth Discipleship: There are 7 guys and 1 girl graduating. In the process of setting up local missions projects--may partner with Berean again and will be done on Saturdays. Youth Worship groups practices each week and have a devotion. Someone is willing to sponsor a worship training or a worship conference. High School youth group will be meeting on Sunday evenings.
