"No, in all these things we are more than conquerors through him who loved us." -Romans 8:37

Lately, I have been pondering the question "What does God think of me?" because as I read the scriptures, it is clear

to me what God thought of me even before I was born. In Psalm 139:14, "I praise you because I am fearfully and wonderfully made; your works are wonderful, I know that full well." You know most of us Christians know how the story ends. If you have forgotten, read Revelation which tells me we won. God is on the throne and I'm going to be sitting next to Him. My confidence and hope is in God. I know I'm God's treasured possession.

When I first started pastoring, I didn't feel like a pastor, and I didn't look like one either. It took a few years

to realize it didn't matter wether I looked or felt like one, I was chosen by God to "serve" HIM.

So when I look into the mirror in the morning, I ask myself, what does God think of me? I'm assured I'm God's treasured possession, I'm God's child. How did I behave yesterday in my walk. Did I make

April, 2017 minutes approved by consensus.

Financial Report: April, 2017 report approved by consensus. Transfer of \$15,000 from surplus to general fund approved by consensus. Need to actively seek out additional giving.

Deacons Report: Benevolent gift of \$350. Will invite Nick Dobbs & Rachel Edgar to meet with Deacons.

Outreach & Evangelism: Gathering for 8 program discussed and Ministerial Alliance Spring Festival May 19th.

Missions: Nick Dobbs was hired as Community Mission Intern through matching grant funds form GRR Area IV as an intern. 2017 Jamaica Mission Trip update--applying for a GRR missions grant.

Children's Discipleship: VBS is June 6-11. Kids Camp is July 19-22--currently have 26 kids and adults signed up to go. Intern replacement--James Leaton will be attending SIU-E in the fall. Will be seeking and discussing replacement.

Adult Discipleship: Shaker is willing to teach a group again.

Staff Relations/Policies: Will share update at the next meeting.

Finance & Stewardship: Possible Ameren Equalizer--Gina will look into.

Buildings and Grounds: Updated

Buildings & Grounds Maintenance List. Kristy will organize a group for #38--painting the curbs. Approved the gutter repair out of Building Fund. Received a bid on transforming the volleyball court area into additional parking. Existing boiler--Scott Hunziker looked it over and recommended several parts that need to be replaced. Approved by consensus. Nick Dobbs--van approval without minors was approved by consensus.

Security: New security office--converted small room into an office. Wednesday security needed in the fall. Adding 2 doors to seal off the upstairs. Ron not to unlock the doors of the church until 8 am. Will be put in the bulletin and newsletter.

Special Events: Church picnic needs a date in September or October.

Worship Ministry: Youth Sunday May 21. Father's Day June 18. Praise Team Coordinator--Nicolette will assume the role.

College Group Discipleship: Currently studying Ezra. Will try to plan a college activity this summer.

Strategic Action Team: Strategic Plan/ Feasibility Study--Ongoing discussion regarding strategic planning, including a formalized written plan. Committee will continue to keep leadership council advised of developments and recommendations.

Kitchen/ Dinners: Wednesday dinner support--youth will help with the clean up.

Pastor's Report: Need a team to look at the 150th anniversary celebration. Men's steak dinner will be July 9th or 16th. We are hosting the Area IV Conference in April 2018.


