## LEADERSHIP COUNCIL MINUTES JULY, 2019

Meeting was opened with prayer.

Devotional: Jessica Grammar summarized chapter 4 of the book by Thom S. Rainer, "I Will, Nine Traits of the Outwardly Focused Christian."

Last Meeting's Minutes: June 18, 2019 minutes were approved by consensus.

Financial Report: The June 2019 Financial report was approved by consensus.

Deacons Report: The Deacon Care Team met on July 11. There were 13 people who attended/participated in the June 20 communion service at The Voyage Senior Living center. SIH is sponsoring a workshop on August 15: "Priority Health Issues: What next?" Visits with shut-ins were shared and discussed.

Leadership Covenant: Council will schedule a retreat for all leadership to discuss the covenant at length in the fall after the 150th anniversary. Tentative date for the workshop is Sunday, November 3 after church.

Outreach and Evangelism: Council is asking for help with grilling to help Darrel Ewbank at the home football games on 8/30, 9/20, 10/4, and 10/18. Meet the Team is 8/24. Feed the Team is 10/4.

Missions: Jamaica mission team departs Saturday, 7/20. "Feeding Our Neighbor" has been used several times.

▫ The "One Great Hour of Sharing" campaign runs throughout July. Envelopes are in the pews and Chuck Grammar will announce on Sunday, 7/21. Mission team is looking to fill an unfulfilled need to support local schools/children.

Youth Discipleship: Several youth made a spiritual commitment at summer camp. We need to continue to follow through with keeping them involved and motivated. Camp music is an important element of energy and camp sermons are more evan-

gelistic with focused object lessons. We need to develop ways to continue the momentum post-camp. The first Wednesday night youth groups for fall is 8/21.

Children's Discipleship: Camp is 7/28 – 7/31; commissioning is 7/28. Home visits are taking place, but difficult to schedule/connect. A meeting to discuss the new curriculum is scheduled for 8/4. We will start teaching it on 9/8.

Family Discipleship: The Hahnemanns have met with two Sunday classes to date to meet with people and get to know church members. Staff Relations:

▫ Choir Director position: There is still a need for a custodial assistant to help one Sunday a month.

Finance and Stewardship: Stewardship Team met on 7/14. 9/15 will be the kickoff for a stewardship series of presentations for 5 weeks leading up to the 150th anniversary.

Building and Grounds: Gutter flashing repair is nearly done. Tuckpointing to repair leak in balcony has been completed by Cornerstone. External door locks need to be re-keyed (same locks for all doors). Wooden front doors need repair. Youth House soffit/facia needs repairs. Flagpole needs to be replaced. Parlor and sanctuary dividers need to be replaced. Chuck Grammar will get prices.

Special Events: 150th Anniversary October 18-19, Jessica Grammar will be working with the team. Need space to build a float for Apple festival. Need candy donations for the float – announce in bulletin. Team met last week and will meet again in early August. Still looking for outdoor banners, specialty items to give out like ornaments, fans, etc., small gifts to commemorate the 150th anniversary.

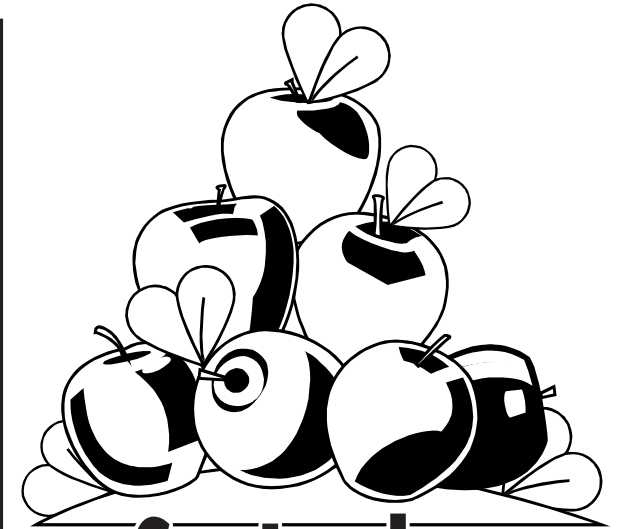
