But he said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Therefore I will boast all the more gladly about my weaknesses, so that Christ's power may rest on me. That is why, for Christ's sake, I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in hardships, in persecutions, in difficulties. For when I am weak, then I am strona." -2 Corinthians 12:9-10

Our culture does not embrace weakness. It seems that this trait will make you appear to be someone who cannot handle life's problems. Our society thinks that people will walk all over you if you are weak. Where as God says it is in our weakness He will be glorified. Paul says in 2 Corinthians 12:9, "My grace is sufficient for you for my power is made perfect in weakness."

Weakness keeps us from boasting. God's desire for us is to empty ourselves

of pride. Weakness keeps us depending on God. Our insufficiencies keep us at the throne of Grace. "The more we are able to acknowledge our weakness, the greater our opportunity to experience God's power in

our lives." (Kyle Idleman in the book, Grace is Greater.)

The strategy Jesus used to select His disciples shows that the power of God is best when people he chose were weak. He did not choose the influential and most powerful people of the day for spreading the gospel. The disciples were not the spiritual elite. They were uneducated,

common, and from the low class of that time. Seven of the apostles were fisherman, one who wanted to overthrow Rome, a tax collector, who the Jews thought was a traitor, and the rest were tradesman of the time. He chose them because His power was to be made perfect in their weakness so that the outcome of their efforts would be credited to HIM and not to the individuals. They received the best seminary education possible by the master.

Jesus chose them because the power of the Holy Spirit will be seen in their service.

They were willing to be open vessels for Jesus to work through. They changed the world. 1 Corinthians 1:27-29 says, "But God chose the foolish things of the world to shame the wise; God chose the weak (continues on page 11)

things of the world to shame the strong. God chose the lowly things of this world and the despised things—and the things that are not—to nullify the things that are, so that no one may boast before him."

We are to <u>admit</u> our weaknesses. We will never discover the hidden strength until we do. It is the power of God that take us through life.

We need to learn to be thankful for the problems we face, the regrettable experiences, the personal traits, and failures God has woven through our life.

We need to learn to share our weaknesses. God longs to work through us because of our weaknesses. Telling others about them is the last thing we want to do, but when we do, we find that we are not the only ones going through them. It actually helps others to feel vulnerable and we enjoy God's grace together.

God's purpose in our weakness is to glorify the grace and power of His son Jesus Christ. (2 Corinthians 12:9-10) God's design is to make in our weakness a show case of Jesus' power.

Hebrews 11:32-40 says, "And what more shall I say? I do not have time to tell about Gideon, Barak, Samson and Jephthah, about David and Samuel and the prophets, who through faith conquered kingdoms, administered justice, and gained what was promised; who shut the mouths of lions, quenched the fury of the flames, and escaped the edge of the sword; whose weakness was turned to strength; and who became powerful in battle and routed foreign armies. Women received back their dead, raised to life again. There were others who were tortured, refusing to be released so that they might gain an even better resurrection. Some faced jeers and flogging, and even chains and *imprisonment.* They were put to death by stoning; they were sawed in two; they were killed by the sword. They went

about in sheepskins and goatskins, destitute, persecuted and mistreated—the world was not worthy of them. They wandered in deserts and mountains, living in caves and in holes in the ground. These were all commended for their faith, yet none of them received what had been promised, since God had planned something better for us so that only together with us would they be made perfect." This exemplifies God's power by the way men and women of faith have endured. Now they are an encouragement to us in our daily walk.

The ultimate purpose of God in our weakness is to glorify the kind of power that moved Christ to the cross and kept Him there until the work of love was done.

Paul says in 1 Corinthians 1:23-25, "but we preach Christ crucified: a stumbling block to Jews and foolishness to Gentiles, but to those whom God has called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than human wisdom, and the weakness of God is stronger than human strength." It is the wisdom of God.

We may not understand why we have weakness, but we know God can use it for His glory and our reward is eternity with Him and share HIS GLORY.

Hope you are looking forward to Thanksgiving and to being grateful for our family in Christ.

LEADERSHIP COUNCIL SEPTEMBER, 2019

Meeting was called to order with prayer. <u>Last Meeting Minutes</u>: August, 2019 minutes were approved by consensus.

Financial Report: The August 2019 Financial was approved by consensus.

<u>Deacons Report</u>: The Deacon Care team met September 9. Pastor Jake Hahnemann conducted communion service at Voyage Senior Living on September 9. Four residents attended.

Agreed to contribute \$200 to START for their Thanksgiving and holiday dinner/parties. Information was distributed about an upcoming SIH workshop on 10/22 "Celebrating Spiritual Care."

Visits with shut-ins were shared. Sylvia Carvell will announce to congregation that SPIN needs blanket donations.

<u>Leadership Covenant</u>: Date for the Leadership Conference is Sunday, November 3 after church.

Ministry Team Reports:

<u>Outreach and Evangelism:</u> Community Night Out is 10/1 (smores station). Feed the Team is 10/4 (contact Deann Stilley). Council members decided that we will not host Halloween night trick-or-treating as it does not set the stage for effective outreach. We will continue to do the Sunday Trunk-or-Treat.

<u>Missions</u>: The mission team plans to go back to the Sunday morning "Mission Moment" presentations.

<u>Youth Discipleship:</u> "Evidence of the Gospel" teaching series is on Wednesday nights. Late night Laser Tag on 10/4/19.

<u>Children's Discipleship</u>: Kids are excited for the new Sunday ministry curriculum – we are two weeks in. There is a need for a teacher for the third to fifth grade group. A text message or announcement in the bulletin will be presented as an "opportunity to serve."

Family Discipleship: Team members are making a focused effort to connect new staff members to church families. Staff Relations: There is still a need for a custodial assistant to be trained to help one Sunday a month. Will send out the request for a volunteer via text messaging. Finance and Stewardship: Stewardship campaign – we have 3 of 4 speakers lined up for the next 4 weeks. Minimum wage increases January 1; we need to evaluate how this will affect our budget for 2020. Building and Grounds: Railing on SW entrance is in progress – confirming ADA compliance. Team is waiting on estimate from Jake Miller for the youth house soffit repair. Special Events: 150th Anniversary celebration team meeting Thursday to finalize plans.

Council members agreed that we should have the children's Christmas program on Sunday morning during the service and have a dinner afterward in the fellowship hall in lieu of the Christmas banquet this year.

<u>Worship and Ministry Team:</u> Jacob Hersh will start working with the Praise team this week. Choir will resume practices on 9/25.

<u>Nominating Team:</u> Kristy Dunning, Vicki Ardrey, and Carol Klaine will be seeking volunteers for the 2020 cycle for Deacons, Council Members, and Clerk.

We know that God is all around But at church He is easy to be found Always in our thoughts and prayer God is good and is everywhere.


First Baptist has been here for many years 150 as a matter of fact, we hear A church full of laughter and tears is a fact Sure will be hard to follow this act.


